I. Welcome and Introductions

The meeting was called to order at 12:03 PM ET by Vice President Rebekah Jarrar, standing in for President Stephen Elam who is ill.

II. Perdoceo Purchase and WASC Review

Chancellor and CEO Vivian Sanchez gave the report on the planned transfer of ownership of the University of St. Augustine for Health Sciences from Altas Partners to Perdoceo Education. Altas Partners identified Perdoceo Education as purchaser after an extensive search. We are currently in the process of seeking regulatory approval for the transfer of ownership.

Members of the USAHS Board of Directors, University leadership, faculty, staff, students and representatives from Perdoceo Education and Altas Partners met with WASC, the regional accreditor for the University, on September 27 on the San Marcos, California campus to discuss the sale and gauge the potential impacts of the transfer of ownership. WASC representatives conducting the interviews were very complimentary and positive. The commission meeting for regulatory ruling with WASC is scheduled for November 6, 2024.

The soonest the transfer of ownership can take place is December 1, with anticipated approval taking place in early 2025. During this transition time, and when the transfer of shares to Perdoceo Education is complete, there is no anticipated impact on programmatic accreditation. There have been extensive discussions with Perdoceo, and they have made it clear that our vision for USAHS is their vision; they would like us to continue doing what we are doing.

<u>Perdoceo Education</u> is a publicly traded organization with 35,000 primarily online students. They are anchored by two universities (Colorado Technical University and American Intercontinental University)

and are accredited by the Higher Learning Commission (HLC) and have both received 10-year accreditation. The corporation is based in Illinois.

The transfer of ownership will result in no substantive changes for the University with no impacts to students or alumni. Perdoceo is looking to USAHS to prop them up and improve the image and reputation of the organization. USAHS will fill a gap for the organization in the field of healthcare. Perdoceo is also a cash-rich organization that will help pay off some of our debt. We are also looking forward to having opportunities for collaboration with the Perdoceo institutions, especially in technology.

Lee Ann Hoffman, faculty on the USAHS Dallas campus made the comment that while leadership has been very transparent with all aspects of this transaction, it has been "business as usual" on all campuses; students have seen minimal impact.

Chancellor Sanchez thanked the Alumni Association Advisory Board for all they do and welcomed future outreach.

III. ANNOUNCEMENT: Kellan Quigley New VP Alumni Engagement Committee

Following the resignation of Christopher Long from the Alumni Association Advisory Board, Kellan Quigley has been appointed as Vice President of the Alumni Engagement Committee for a two-year term effective immediately. This action was approved by the Executive Committee at the August 9, 2024, meeting.
