The entry-level occupational therapy master's degree (MOT) programs at the San Marcos, California; St. Augustine and Miami, Florida; Austin and Dallas, Texas campuses are accredited by the Accreditation Council for Occupational Therapy Education (ACOTE) of the American Occupational Therapy Education (ACOTE) of the American Occupational Therapy Association (ACOTE) at 7501 Wisconsin Avenue, Suite 510E, Bethesda, MD 20814. ACOTE's telephone number c/o AOTA is (301) 652-AOTA and its web address is www.acoteonline.org. Graduates of the program will be eligible to sit for the national certification examination for the occupational therapist administered by the National Board for Certification in Occupational Therapy (NBCOT). After successful completion of this exam, the individual will be an Occupational Therapist, Registered (OTR). In addition, all states require licensure in order to Practice; however, state licenses are usually based on the results of the NBCOT Certification Examination. A felony conviction may affect a graduate's ability to sit for the NBCOT Certification examination or attain state licensure.

Students must complete 24 weeks of Level II fieldwork within 24 months following completion of the didatic portion of the program.
